


CHI Lakeside

In early 2019, CHI partnered with Ocuvera to evaluate Ocuvera's next-generation fall risk reduction technology as part of a study funded by Ocuvera and the state of Nebraska. The Ocuvera system acts as a second set of eyes on each patient. With 3D cameras and AI to automatically monitor patients, Ocuvera predicts when they may be at risk of falling and sends video alerts to nurses.



CHI Lakeside jumped at the opportunity and so, in 2020, 60 sensors were installed in 60 rooms across 2 units (progressive care and med-surg). Nurses at Lakeside started using the Ocuvera system on November 19th, 2020. Lakeside is currently expanding use of the Ocuvera system to an additional 28-bed unit.


